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Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

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Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

Objective

A. Definition of Mutual Aid

Mutual aid is an organized, supervised, coordinated, cooperative, reciprocal assistance in which personnel, apparatus, equipment, and physical facilities of all participating fire departments, regardless of type or size, are utilized for fire or other emergencies in which the services of firefighters would be used throughout the County of Broome and adjacent areas.

B. Amendments

Amendments to this plan may be periodically made via the following procedure:

1. Prepared by the Broome County Fire Coordinator
2. Adopted by the Broome County Fire Chief's Association Inc., Board of Directors.
3. Adopted by the Broome County Fire Chief's Association Inc.
4. Adopted by the Broome County Firefighter's Association
5. Adopted by the Broome County Fire Advisory Board
6. Submitted by the Director of Emergency Services to the Broome County Legislature for adoption.
7. Admitted into the New York State Fire Mobilization Plan and Mutual Aid Plan.

C. Annual Review

Each year, this plan shall be reviewed by the Fire Coordinator for potential corrections and/or necessary changes. The plan shall also be updated every five (5) years pursuant to 9 NYCRR 205.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan Participation

A. Extent and Limit of Participation by Fire Departments

All cities, towns, villages, fire districts, industrial fire brigades, and the Binghamton University Emergency Response Team may participate in this plan. State and Federal Institutions may participate in this plan as State and Federal Laws allow (Appendix A).

B. Extent and Limit of Participation with the Counties of Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, and Tioga Counties of New York.

Mutual Aid is provided to and received from these counties through their respective County Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) under the direction of their County Fire Coordinator or legally appointed deputies.

C. Extent and Limit of Participation with Adjacent Counties in Pennsylvania.

There is no formal agreement with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Local reciprocal assistance, if any, shall be in accordance with Section 209 of the General Municipal Law. All requests for assistance will be routed through the Broome County Communications Center.

Those departments willing to provide services to fire departments across state lines may do so after assuring proper insurance coverage for personnel, apparatus, and equipment. Departments must indicate their availability to respond, in writing, to the Fire Coordinator.

D. Entering and Participating in the Plan

Any duly established fire department, fire company, or fire brigade may participate in this plan by filing a copy of the resolution adopted by the fire department, fire company, or fire brigade with the Office of the County Fire Coordinator.

Such resolution shall state that such fire department, fire company, or fire brigade elects to participate in the Broome County Mutual Aid Plan and will comply with provisions of such plan. The resolution shall state that the fire department, fire company, or fire brigade recognize a call for assistance from another fire department, fire company, or fire brigade through the Broome County Communications Center.

Each fire department, fire company, or fire brigade participating in this plan must respond forthwith to any call for assistance from another fire department, fire company, or fire brigade made pursuant to the provisions of this plan, unless conditions preclude it and further agrees that only those resources requested or planned for previously are to be sent (Appendix B).

There shall also be filed with the County Fire Coordinator, a copy of a resolution adopted by the legislative body of each participating city, village, or Board of Fire Commissioners of each fire district participating, or the town board of each town in relation to the participating fire department or fire company serving territories outside of cities, villages, and fire districts, or in relation to a town fire department; such resolution shall state that no resolution exists against "Outside Service" by the fire department or fire company of the municipality or district within the meaning of Section 209 of the General Municipal Law which would affect the power of such fire departments or fire companies to participate in the Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan. (Appendix C)

If the Outside Service activities of the participating fire department or fire company are restricted pursuant to Section 209 of the General Municipal Law, notice of any restriction shall be given promptly to the Fire Coordinator. Any such restriction imposed by the legislative body of a city, village, or town or by the Board of Fire Commissioners of a fire district shall take effect in accordance with the resolution imposing the restrictions.

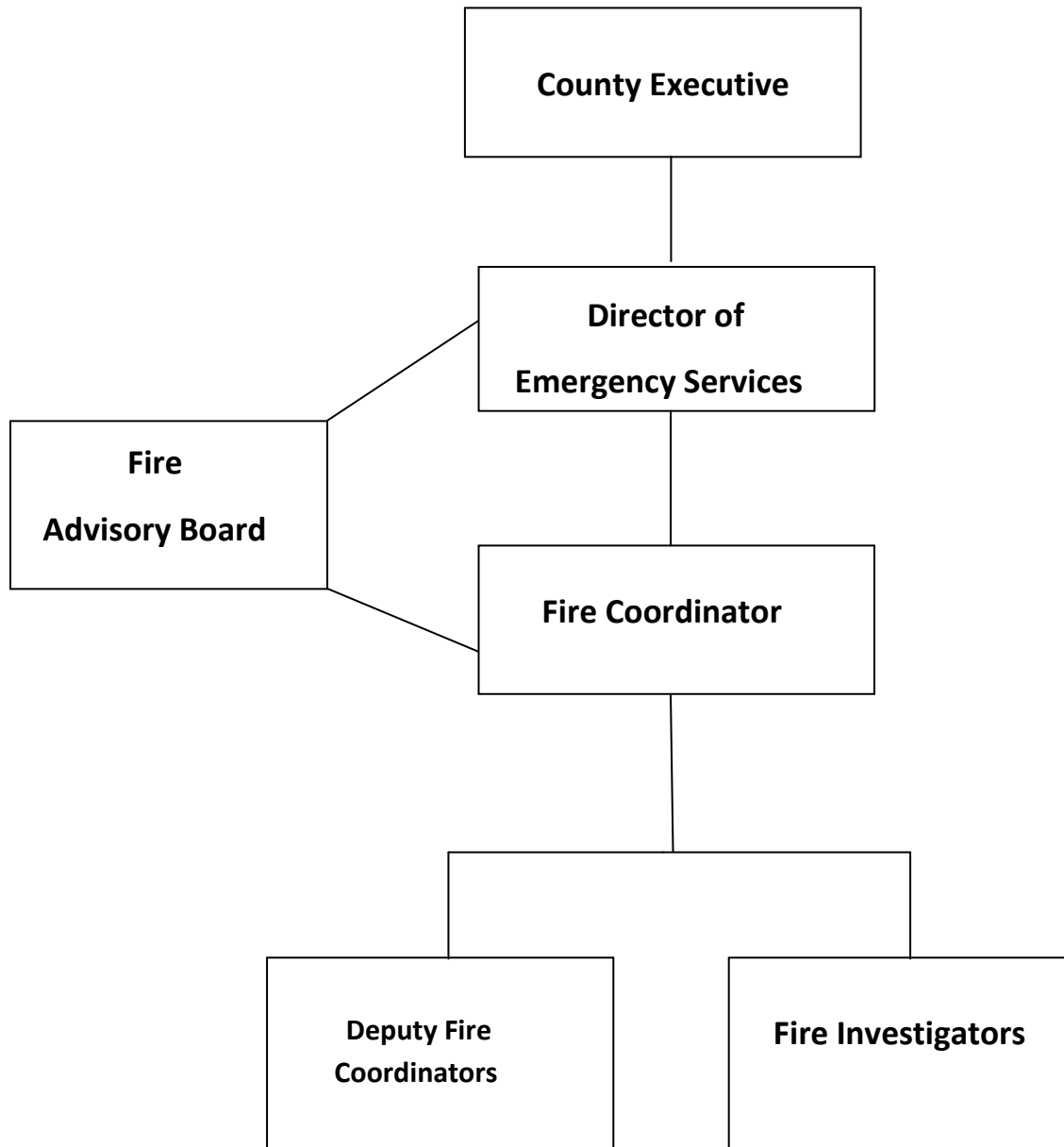
E. Withdrawal from the Plan

Any fire department, fire company, or fire brigade may elect to withdraw from this plan by adopting a resolution to such an affect. Such withdrawal shall become effective ninety (90) days after filing such notice with the County Fire Coordinator.

Withdrawal from this plan will result in the suspension of Mutual Aid pursuant to this plan to the fire department, fire company or fire brigade taking such action. Such withdrawal shall remain in effect until reinstated by resolution as defined by section 209 of the General Municipal Law. On the effective date of withdrawal, the fire department, fire company, or fire brigade shall surrender and return to Broome County, all county-owned equipment.

Broome County Fire Advisory Board is composed of Directors from the Broome County Fire Chief's Association and the Broome County Firefighter's Association as defined in the Broome County Charter.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

Extent and Limit of Authority of Fire Coordinator and Deputies

A. County Fire Coordinator

As Chief Fire Officer at the County Level for the fire service:

1. Administers the State Fire Training program and all training programs developed by the state or by his/her office throughout the county.
2. Selects and establishes locations for courses, determines the need for existing courses and new courses.
3. Maintains records indicating manpower in the county including the type and extent of training in each department.
4. Administers the County Fire Mutual Aid Plan and is responsible for the efficient operation of the plan for intra and inter county purposes at fires and or where the service of firefighters is used.
5. Coordinates the Broome County Communications Center Fire Dispatch Policy with the Communications Supervisor, maintains an inventory of manpower, apparatus, and equipment.
6. Acts as a liaison officer between the fire service of Broome County and the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control, the County Legislature and the County Fire Advisory Board.
7. May appoint and remove Deputy Fire Coordinators in accordance with Broome County Policy and state laws.
8. Plans and estimates the need for additional or unique equipment for the county and recommends the purchase of such equipment.
9. Acts as an aide to the county fire chiefs in cases of mutual aid alarms of fires or other incidents requiring the services of firefighters and requests the Broome County Communications Center dispatch such aid at the request of the fire chief.
10. Oversees participation of the New York State Fire Reporting System and Burn Incident Reporting conducted by the State Office of Fire Prevention and Control.
11. Issues statements to the newspapers, radio, television, press wire services, news outlets, and social media in accordance with Broome County Policy.

12. Arranges for speaking engagements and programs to promote the Broome County Fire Service.
13. Administers the County Arson Control Plan (Appendix C).
14. Administers the County Hazardous Materials Response Plan – ESF 10 (Appendix D).
15. Is notified whenever an incident requires mutual aid except for automatic mutual aid in accordance with established policy.
16. Oversees operations of the Broome County Wild-land Search Team, Hazardous Materials Response Team, Technical Rescue Team, and the Broome County Bureau of Fire Investigation.
17. Inspects Fire Apparatus for resource kind and typing, and assigns radio identifiers to all fire units in accordance with the Broome County Fire Radio Policy.

B. Deputy Fire Coordinators

1. Performs the duties or functions of the County Fire Coordinator when so directed or authorized by the County Fire Coordinator.
2. Shall possess powers of, and perform the duties and functions of, the Fire Coordinator during the absence of the Fire Coordinator or during his/her inability to act, in accordance with the provisions of the chain of command elsewhere set forth in this plan, and pursuant to Section 401 of the General Municipal Law.

C. County Communications Center Dispatcher(s)

Directly responsible to the Communications Supervisor:

1. Dispatchers will be responsible for the operations of the County Communications Center and for maintaining efficient dispatching procedures to ensure that apparatus and fire personnel will be promptly dispatched to fires and other emergencies. Responsible for maintaining complete and accurate County Communications Center records and all other duties assigned by the Communications Supervisor or his/her designee. Dispatchers shall test communications dispatch equipment at the County Communications Center and in finding said equipment inoperative, shall notify the proper chain of command.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

Line of Authority

A. Absence of the County Fire Coordinator

The County Fire Coordinator shall notify the Director of Emergency Services in writing, the order in which Deputy Coordinators are to possess the powers and perform the duties of the County Fire Coordinator during his absence or inability to act, pursuant to Section 401 of the County Law (Appendix E)

B. Vacancy in Position of the County Fire Coordinator

The Director of Emergency Services shall designate a Deputy Fire Coordinator who shall possess the powers and perform the duties of the County Fire Coordinator until a successor is appointed by the Broome County Executive as recommended by the Broome County Fire Advisory Board.

Status of the Local Fire Department

A. Maintenance of Individuality

Each fire department or fire company participating in this plan shall retain its internal command structure and individuality.

B. Authority of Requesting Fire Chief, Officer in Charge, or Incident Commander

1. A requesting fire chief, officer in charge, or incident commander is one who requests mutual aid for his/her department or specific equipment in accordance with this plan.
2. The “Chain of Command” at a fire or emergency scene in which mutual aid is requested, remains with the requesting department.

3. The fire officer in command of the fire or emergency will work with chiefs, senior officers, and company officers of departments providing mutual aid. The firefighters in assisting departments will be supervised by their own officers who are, in-turn commanded by the officers of the department requesting mutual aid.

Operations of the County Communications Center

A. Dispatching Services

1. The County Fire Coordinator and the Deputy Fire Coordinators are authorized to request additional resources to be dispatched, as necessary.

B. Radio and Telephone Regulation Communications

1. The radio and telephone procedure shall conform in every respect with that prescribed by the Federal Communications Commission and Broome County Fire Radio Policy.
2. Each participating fire department, fire company, or fire brigade will provide their own radio and telephone equipment to contact the Broome County Communications Center, and shall conform to the Federal Communications Commission Regulations, with respect to licensing and operation of all radio equipment, subject to approval of the Fire Coordinator and Public Safety Systems Administrator.
3. No radio may operate on the fire frequencies as part of the Broome County Fire Radio System unless specifically authorized by the County Fire Coordinator and Public Safety Systems Administrator. All radios must operate in accordance with the Federal Communications Commission and must be equipped with a time-out timer set at a maximum of 45 seconds. This includes cross-band repeaters.
4. Identifiers for all apparatus will be designated by the Fire Coordinator after an inspection of said apparatus has been completed. A list of apparatus identified by the Fire Coordinator will be made available to each fire department, fire company, and fire brigade. (Appendix F)
5. A fully redundant back-up 911 center has been established and maintained by Broome County and shall serve as a back-up center during emergencies and maintenance at the main center, as well as anytime the main center is overrun during a major incident.

C. Communications with Neighboring Counties

1. There is direct county-level radio contact with the following adjoining New York counties on LFIRE4D (45.88);
 - a. Chenango County
 - b. Cortland County
 - c. Delaware County
 - d. Tioga County
2. Contact with neighboring Susquehanna County in Pennsylvania shall be done via telephone (570) 278-3841.
3. Telephone numbers for these adjoining PSAP's shall be listed at the Broome County Communications Center.

D. Communications with Local Departments

2. The county-wide paging frequency shall be 159.10500

E. Method of Determining Status of Apparatus, Equipment, and Manpower

1. Fire departments, companies, and brigades shall be responsible for updating their apparatus and equipment status with the County Communications Center or Fire Coordinator.
2. Apparatus and equipment status shall be tracked via the Computer Aided Dispatch System.
3. Any long-term out of service notifications or requests for special mutual aid shall require notification of the Fire Coordinator.
4. Fire departments, companies, and brigades are strongly encouraged to notify their neighboring departments of any status changes in apparatus and equipment.
5. Any apparatus out of service requests greater than thirty (30) days in duration shall require a response plan change.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan Resource Inventory

A. Location of County Resource Inventory

1. The County Resource Inventory Records shall be kept as follows:
 - a. County Communications Primary Center
 - b. County Communications Back-up Center
 - c. Fire Coordinator's Vehicle
 - d. Deputy Fire Coordinators Vehicles
2. The fire coordinator is responsible for maintaining the county resource inventory.
3. Each fire chief shall be responsible for notifying the fire coordinator of any changes in his/her department inventory.
4. It shall be the responsibility of each fire department, fire company, or fire brigade to continuously maintain a list of active members with the fire coordinator.
5. Pursuant to the New York State Fire Mobilization and Mutual Aid Plan and this plan, an updated inventory and key personnel sheet shall be completed annually and forwarded to the fire coordinator. These forms shall be received from each department by no later than April 1st each year, at which time the fire coordinator will forward them to New York State Office of Fire Prevention & Control. (Appendix G)

Coordination with other Emergency Services

Informal agreements exist with other services and close liaison is maintained with law enforcement, emergency management, amateur and commercial radio. A record of telephone numbers of these services is maintained in the communications center.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan Standardization

Hose Threads & Couplings

1. All apparatus and its associated equipment participating in this plan should be equipped with National Standard Threads (NST) as defined by the National Bureau of Standards, or provide sufficient adapters to permit inter-connection with NST.
2. Quick-Connecting Couplings shall be used for large diameter hose with consideration given to locking couplings.

Default Response Plans

1. Any department failing to submit response plans for the following incident types shall be assigned a default response plan: (Appendix J)
 - a. House Fires
 - b. Building Fires
 - c. MVA's
 - d. Brush Fires
 - e. Service Calls (All other)

Training Requirements

1. The New York State Training Program shall be adopted as a standard for the County of Broome through the Broome County Fire Coordinator. All county firefighters are strongly recommended to be in compliance with New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control's Recommended Best Practices for Fire Department Training Programs by January 1st, 2024. (Appendix H)

2. It is recommended that all county green-tag (interior) firefighters complete the following New York State Fire Training Courses:

- Firefighter I or equivalent
- SCBA Confidence
- Firefighter Survival

Accountability Requirements

1. All fire departments, companies, and brigades participating in this plan shall utilize a standardized accountability system for tracking their personnel. Preference shall be given to the county's identification and credentialing system.
2. The following color scheme shall be utilized to identify firefighters in Broome County;
 - Red Tag – Exterior Firefighter (Limited Duty)
 - Yellow Tag – Non-Interior Firefighter (May Use SCBA)
 - Green Tag – Interior Firefighter
3. The following color scheme shall be utilized to identify water rescue trained personnel in Broome County;
 - Red Tag – Shore Support Only
 - Orange Tag – Craft Operator
 - Blue Tag – Entry Person (Swift Water Technician)

County Wide Fire Reporting

A. County Wide Fire Reporting

Under the guidelines of General Municipal Law Section 204-D, the Fire Chief shall file with the Office of Fire Prevention and Control, a field incident report for every incident. These reports shall be submitted to the above-named office on a regular basis. The fire coordinator shall encourage each chief or designated officer to file a copy of the New York State Field Incident Report and other appropriate reports on a monthly basis with the Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

B. County Wide Hazardous Material Reporting

Under the guidelines of General Municipal Law Section 209-U, the Fire Chief or designated officer shall file with the Office of the Fire Coordinator, a copy of the Hazardous Material Substance Report submitted by local facilities who store hazardous materials on their premises.

Apparatus & Equipment Maintenance and Testing

1. All fire departments shall be required to maintain and test their apparatus and equipment per NFPA Standards by January 1st, 2020.
2. These tests include but are not limited to;
 - a. Apparatus Pump Tests
 - b. Aerial and Ground Ladder Testing
 - c. S.C.B.A. Flow Testing
 - d. Hose Testing
 - e. Hydraulic Tool Testing
3. All interior firefighters shall be fit tested annually per OSHA Standard 29CFR 1910.134.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

Participation in the New York State Mobilization and Mutual Aid Plan.

A. Procedure to Obtain Activation of the Plan

1. The County Fire Coordinator or a Deputy Fire Coordinator in the line of authority designated pursuant to Section 401 of the County Law, after utilizing all available assistance from Chenango Cortland, Delaware, and Tioga Counties, may contact the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control to obtain activation of the State Fire Mobilization and Mutual Aid Plan.
2. The procedure shall conform with that specified in the New York State Fire Mobilization and Mutual Aid Plan by the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

B. Authority and Responsibility of the Regional Fire Administrator

The authority and responsibility of the Regional Fire Administrator under the activated New York State Fire Mobilization and Mutual Aid Plan is established by the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

C. Retirement Provision Relating to the Position of Regional Fire Administrator

Should the County Fire Coordinator be separated from his office for any reason, he is automatically retired as Administrator if he also holds the position of the Regional Fire Administrator. The fire administrator of the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control is authorized by law to appoint to this position.

Broome County Fire Mutual Aid Plan

D. Broome County Emergency Disaster Operations

This plan as approved shall become part of and be noted as the Emergency Support Function 4 Firefighting within the Broome County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.

E. Incident Management System

The Incident Management System shall be utilized in accordance with New York State's Executive Order #26, Dated March 5th, 1996 and in accordance with Homeland Security Presidential Directive #5.
