#49 RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2005 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE INTERMODAL CENTER PROJECT

Mr. Diffendorf asked Mr. Brennan to explain why the project went over budget. Mr. Brennan stated that the project, which is nearly completed, had encountered inflation and unexpected expenses. Mr. Brennan provided a list of the unexpected expenses and also noted that it is unusual for a project to span eight to nine years and cover eleven properties.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO 4 OF 2010, ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW CREATING CHAPTER 100 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE PROVIDING THAT A SPECIAL HAULING PERMIT SHALL BE REQUIRED FOR USE OF COUNTY ROADS BY CERTAIN VEHICLES THAT EXCEED THE WEIGHT OR DIMENSIONAL LIMITS IN SECTION 385 OF THE VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK."

Mr. Denk announced that a letter from the County Executive was sent out to all municipalities in the county. The letter explains the progress made in the development of the local law and expresses her support of this law.
