

**NOTICE OF INTENT
MOSQUITO LARVACIDE APPLICATION
BROOME COUNTY, NEW YORK**

1. The Broome County Health Department is planning to perform a mosquito larvacide treatment. The larvacide will be placed in storm sewers with catch basins in selected localities in Broome County. The larvaciding will be done to prevent the spread of West Nile Virus by preventing adult mosquitos from developing.
2. The specific treatment will encompass all areas bounded by:
 - a. From the Pennsylvania line to the south, east to Bush Road in the Town of Windsor.
 - b. Then north to the Town of Kirkwood along Grange Hall Road. Northerly along Burtis Road, Kutalek Road, and Johnson Road to the intersection of Route 17. Then northeasterly to Stratmill Road.
 - c. North to the Town of Fenton and Port Crane. Then north along the Chenango River.
 - d. From Chenango Forks in the Town of Chenango, west along East Hill Road to Castle Creek. Then southerly along Brooks Road, Chenango Road, Upper Stella Ireland Road, and Airport Road.
 - e. Westerly along the Town of Dickinson line.
 - f. Westerly along the Village of Johnson City line.
 - g. Then west along Sally Piper Road, and Twist Run Road in the Town of Union west to the Tioga County line. Then south along the County line.
 - h. From Ross Corners in the Town of Vestal easterly along Jones Road, Foster Road, Fuller Hollow Road, and Powderhouse Road.
 - i. Easterly along Ingram Hill Road and Hawleyton Road in the Town of Binghamton to Carman Road. Easterly along Gardner Road, Pierce Creek Road, and Murphy Road.
 - j. Southerly along Murphy Road in the Town of Conklin. Then southeasterly to the Pennsylvania line.
3. A map of the specific areas to be treated is on file at the Broome County health Department, Division of Environmental Health located at 225 Front Street, Binghamton, NY 13905. The map is available for public viewing between the hours of 8:30 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.
4. Vectolex CG (EPA Reg. #275-77 active ingredient Bacillus sphaericus) is the product which will be used. This larvacide is registered by the EPA to have a toxicity category of "Caution".
5. Larvacide application will occur from August 31, 2001 through September 7, 2001 with alternate dates, for inclement weather, of September 8, 2001 through September 15, 2001.
6. The target pests are mosquitoes in the larval stage of development, specifically those species known to transmit West Nile Virus.
