 - c) Update on COVID 19 (Corona Virus) Mike Bender/Ray Serowick
 - a. **Mental Health** staffing is a challenge for providers, vaccines requirements have contributed. Proposals in governor's budget for reimbursement. A lot of energy on state level planning in the end of 2024, but no money.
 - b. **Social Services** code blue-high numbers due to weather. Permanent housing shortage. Doing the best they can, and housing who they can. Substance use remains at a high level.
