FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative is hereby authorized to execute any such agreements, documents or papers, approved as to form by the Department of Law, as may be necessary to implement the intent and purpose of this Resolution, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative is hereby empowered (with the approval of the grantor agency) to reduce the time period of the grant provided there is no change in the grant budget or extend the terms of the grant agreement for the purpose of expending any unexpended grant funds, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative (including the Director of Management and Budget and/or Comptroller) is hereby authorized to make any transfers of funds within this grant budget provided that employee head count is not increased, the County's contribution is not increased, and the salary rate or salary total for a position is not changed.

RESOLUTION BROOME COUNTY LEGISLATURE BINGHAMTON, NEW YORK

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 80 of 2017, authorized renewal of the agreement with CST/Your Link to Life and Project H.E.A.R. for personal emergency response services for the Office for Aging at the current Medicaid rates for the period April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018, and

WHEREAS, said agreements are necessary to provide, as needed, installation and monitoring of personal emergency response units for the Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program clients, and

PASSENGER FACILITY CHARGE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION (2018)

The project involves the administration of the Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) program at the Greater Binghamton Airport (BGM) through January 31, 2019.

The existing PFC program allows BGM to impose and use funds as permitted by Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 158, *Passenger Facility Charges*. The goals of this project are to assist the County of Broome (SPONSOR) with management of the PFC Program which provides funds for the local share of approved Airport Improvement Program (AIP) capital improvement projects as well as additional projects deemed eligible by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). It is understood that the SPONSOR will resume management of the PFC Program upon completion of this assignment, including the reporting of collections, physical project completion and financial completion to the FAA until all projects are physically completed, all related bonds have been retired, and all funds approved have been collected. Professional services to be provided by McFarland Johnson (CONSULTANT) shall include the following:

A. <u>ADMINISTRATION/PROJECT MANAGEMENT:</u>

The focus of this task is to maintain effective communication with Airport Management and the SPONSOR, manage the project budget, and coordinate the timing of all tasks within the project to ensure completion within the project schedule. Specific subtasks will include:

a. Preparation of a project plan and overall project schedule

b. Internal coordination meetings

- c. Up to one (1) meeting between CONSULTANT and SPONSOR will be conducted at BGM
- d. Up to one (1) teleconference will occur between CONSULTANT, SPONSOR, and FAA

e. Drafting of miscellaneous agency correspondence



B. <u>SELECTION OF FUTURE PFC PROJECTS & MAINTENANCE OF CASHFLOW</u> <u>PROJECTIONS:</u>

This task includes assisting the SPONSOR in identifying projects for inclusion in the PFC program and maintenance of cash flow projections for PFC collections at BGM. Specific subtasks will include:

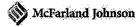
- a. Review of the SPONSORS goals and Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) as well as examine projects that have been completed in previous years, as applicable.
- b. Provide the SPONSOR with an opinion of PFC eligibility for projects considered for inclusion in the PFC Program.
- c. Assist the SPONSOR in selecting a final list of projects for the PFC Program for all Notice of Intent submittals and determining the funding method for each project (i.e., pay-as-you-go or bonding).
- d. Update cashflow projections for each year of the PFC Program based on previously approved PFC projects and those selected for a future Notice of Intents submittal. Annual and quarterly enplanements forecasts will be utilized to identify anticipated PFC collections at BGM.

C. <u>PREPARATION OF NOTICE OF INTENT DOCUMENTATION:</u>

This task includes the preparation of documents required for up to one (1) PFC Notice of Intent submittal to the FAA, as well as the required review of draft and final documents by the SPONSOR, FAA, and other stakeholders. The PFC Notice of Intent will be completed in accordance with 14 CFR 158.30, *PFC Authorization at Non-Hub Airports*. Per these requirements, the following subtasks will be completed:

- 1. <u>Airline Coordination</u>: This subtask involves attendance at the consultation meeting held with the airlines maintaining or planned for a significant business interest at BGM, regarding projects proposed for submittal as part of a PFC Notice of Intent. The SPONSOR will be required to develop all documentation required for the meeting, including notices to the air carriers and presentation materials based on application documentation provided by the CONSULTANT in advance. CONSULTANT will attend one (1) airline coordination meeting to assist the SPONSOR with answering any questions that may arise during the meeting.
 - <u>Compilation of Draft PFC Notice of Intent Documents</u>: Using documentation compiled through the previous tasks and subtasks, this subtask will result in the preparation of the new PFC Notice of Intent request. As noted, the PFC Notice of Intent will be completed in accordance with 14 CFR 159.30. The following items will be included in the submittal:

- A completed FAA Form 5500-1, PFC Application (latest edition) without attachments except as required below.
- b. Project information (in the form and manner prescribed by the FAA) including project title, PFC funds sought, PFC level sought, project description and, if an existing Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant already covers a project, the grant agreement number.
- c. If the proposed projects are not covered by an existing AIP grant, a description of how this project meets the adequate justification of 14 CFR 158.17.
- d. A copy of all documents provided from and received by the SPONSOR during the air carrier consultation and public comment processes (as defined by 14 CFR 158.23 and .24) and the SPONSOR'S response to any disagreements.
- e. A signed statement by the SPONSOR certifying that the agency will comply with the assurances set forth in the FAA Form 5500-1.

This subtask will also include the compilation of documentation regarding the status of the Airport Layout Plan, environmental and airspace findings for each project. If these findings have not been made yet, it will be noted accordingly. This subtask does not include the completion of documentation for environmental reviews, the completion of airspace analysis, or pen & ink changes to the approved Airport Layout Plan.

D. PREPARATION OF PFC AMENDMENT DOCUMENTATION:

This task includes the preparation of documents required for up to one (1) submittal of amendments to the FAA for projects previously approved to impose and use PFCs at BGM. This task will also include the required review of draft and final documents by the SPONSOR, FAA, and other stakeholders (as applicable). The amendment documentation will be completed in accordance with 14 CFR 158.37; *Amendment of Approved PFC*. Per these requirements, the following subtasks will be completed:

1. <u>Update Project Costs for Amendments:</u> Under this subtask, projects completed utilizing funds approved for collection and use in previous PFC Applications will be analyzed to determine shortfalls or balances in project funding and to determine if projects remain applicable. These costs will be updated in the PFC account cash flow documents. As stated in 14 CFR 158.37, airline consultation and public coordination will only be required for an amendment where there is a change in scope or where the total PFC portion of a project costs is greater than \$1,000,000 and the proposed increase in the PFC portion of project costs is greater than 25%. Should airline consultation and public coordination be required for an amendment to a project, the completion of the amendment and the required coordination will

occur concurrently with coordination for a new PFC Notice of Intent as identified in Task C.

2. <u>Prepare Amendment Request Form Report:</u> This subtask will include preparation of an Amendment Request Form Report for all previous PFC Applications and Notices of Intent where projects will be amended. This task will include the completion and submittal of a report for all projects identified in the previous subtask, as well as the preparation of an FAA Form 5500-1 to accompany each Amendment Request Form Report.

SCHEDULE

The proposed scheduled will include administration of the Greater Binghamton Airport's Passenger Facility Charge Program through January 31, 2019. During this time, up to one (1) PFC Notice of Intent application is anticipated for submission to the FAA. The schedule for the submission of documents will be coordinated with the Airport and will be based on funding priorities at the time. It is anticipated that a complete PFC Notice of Intent, from start to acknowledgement by the FAA, will take up to eight (8) months.

ASSUMPTIONS

- PFC Notice of Intent will be prepared in accordance with 14 CFR 158.30. The submission of a complete PFC Application (outside of a PFC Notice of Intent) will be considered out of scope work and will be subject to a separate or supplemental agreement.
- The completion of any required airline consultation and public coordination efforts for projects to be amended will be completed by the SPONSOR concurrently with similar airline consultation and public coordination efforts for the PFC Notice of Intent application.
- Any projects that will be considered "Impose Only" will require the submission of "Use Only" documentation within three years of the start of PFC collections. The submission of "Use Only" documentation will be considered out of scope work if completed after the submission of the PFC Notice of Intent and will be subject to a separate or supplemental agreement.
- All airline meetings will be conducted at BGM.
- The SPONSOR will be responsible for the development and distribution of all public notice documents as required under 14 CFR 158. Public advertisements will be the responsibility of the SPONSOR.
- No meetings will be included other than those specifically identified in this Scope of Services.

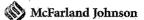

RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 OF 2018, ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 50 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE, ENERGIZE NY BENEFIT FINANCING PROGRAM"

WHEREAS, this County Legislature hereby finds and determines that Broome County enacted Local Law No. 5 of 2015 pursuant to provisions of New York General Municipal Law, to establish a Sustainable Energy Loan Program. This program authorized the Energy Improvement Corporation ("EIC"), a local development corporation acting on behalf of Broome County, to make funds available to qualified property owners for the installation of renewable energy systems and energy-efficiency measures, and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature further finds that the New York State Legislature recently amended certain provisions of the municipal sustainable energy loan program to "eliminate barriers that have been identified that have prevented the program from reaching its full potential", and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature finds that the amendments to the program, enacted as Chapter 320 of the 2017 Laws of the State of New York, seek to encourage net metered and community solar projects, will allow Broome County's program to use monies available from the State or any State authority, and will permit a more flexible loan standard for commercial properties, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the purpose of this law is to amend Broome County's Sustainable Energy Loan Program in conformity with changes recently enacted to the New York State enabling legislation, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 1 of 2018, entitled: "A Local Law Amending Chapter 50 of the Broome County Charter and Code, Energize NY Benefit Financing Program," be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any municipal agreements with the EIC that are established under the authority of this Local Law and any amendments or modifications to those municipal agreements, must be enacted and approved by the Broome County Legislature through a Resolution.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 of 2018

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 50 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE, ENERGIZE NY BENEFIT FINANCING PROGRAM

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of Broome County, New York, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u> Chapter 50 of the Broome County Charter and Code is amended as follows:

§ 50-1. Short title.

This chapter shall be known as the "Energize NY Benefit Financing Program," and shall read as follows:

§ 50-2. Legislative findings, intent and [;] purpose authority.

- A. This chapter establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation ("EIC"), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of the County of Broome pursuant to the municipal agreement to be entered into between the County of Broome and EIC pursuant to Article 5-G of the new York General Municipal Law ("the Municipal Agreement"), to make funds available to qualified property owners that will be repaid by such property owners through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this law and fulfilling an important public purpose. [This chapter establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation (EIC), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of Broome County, to make funds available to qualified property owners that will be repaid by such property owners through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this section and fulfilling an important public purpose.]
- B Broome County is authorized to implement this Energize NY Benefit Financing Program pursuant to **the Municipal Home Rule Law and** Article 5-L of the New York General Municipal Law.
- C. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Energize NY Benefit Financing Program Law of Broome County."

§ 50-3. Definitions.

For purposes of this chapter and unless otherwise expressly stated or unless the context requires, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

AUTHORITY — The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, as defined by subdivision two of section 1851 of the Public Authorities Law, or its successor.

COUNTY — Broome County, State of New York

EIC — The Energy Improvement Corporation, a local development corporation, duly organized under section 1411 of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law, authorized hereby on behalf of the County to implement the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program by providing funds to qualified property owners (as defined in this chapter) and providing for repayment of such funds from monies collected by the County Tax Collector as a charge to be levied on the real property and collected in the same manner and same form as the County taxes.

ENERGY AUDIT — A formal evaluation or "assessment" of the energy consumption of a permanent building or structural improvement to real property, conducted by a contractor certified by the Authority, or certified by a certifying entity approved by the Authority, for the purpose of identifying appropriate energy efficiency improvements that could be made to the property.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT — Any renovation or retrofitting of a building to reduce energy consumption, such as window and door replacement, lighting, caulking, weather stripping, air sealing, insulation, and heating and cooling system upgrades, and similar improvements, determined to be cost effective pursuant to criteria established by the Authority, not including lighting measures or household appliances that are not permanently fixed to real property.

QUALIFIED PROPERTY OWNER — An owner of a residential or commercial property located within the boundaries of the County that is determined to be eligible to participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program under the procedures for eligibility set forth under this chapter.

RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM — An energy generating system for the generation of electric or thermal energy, to be used primarily as such property, <u>except when the Qualified</u> <u>Property Owner is a commercial entity in which case the system may be used for other</u> <u>properties in addition to the subject property</u> by means of solar thermal, solar photovoltaic, wind, geothermal, anaerobic digester gas-to-electricity systems, fuel cell technologies, or other renewable energy technology approved by the Authority not including the combustion or pyrolysis of solid waste.

RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM FEASIBILITY STUDY — A written study, conducted by a contractor certified by the Authority, or certified by a certifying entity approved by the Authority, for the purpose of determining the feasibility of installing a renewable energy system.

§ 50-4. Establishment of an Energize NY Benefit Financing Program.

- A. An Energize NY Benefit Financing Program is hereby established by the County, whereby EIC acting on its behalf <u>pursuant to the Municipal Agreement whereby EIC</u> <u>acting on its behalf pursuant to the Municipal Agreement</u>, may provide funds to Qualified Property Owners in accordance with the procedures set forth under this Chapter, to finance the acquisition, construction and installation of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements and the verification of the installation of such systems and improvements.
- B. The funds provided to a Qualified Property Owner which is a commercial entity, not-for-profit organization, or entity other that an individual EIC shall have the authority to impose requirements on the maximum amount of funds to be provided, which may consider factors including but not limited to the property value, projected savings, project cost, and existing indebtedness secured by such property. [shall not exceed the lesser of 10% of the appraised value of the real property where the renewable energy systems and/or energy efficiency improvements will be located, or the actual cost of installing the renewable energy systems and/or energy efficiency improvements, including the costs of necessary equipment, materials, and labor and the cost of verification of such systems and improvements.]
- C. For Financings made to a Qualified Property Owner who is an individual, the funds provided shall not exceed the lesser of: (i) ten percent of the appraised value of the real property where the Renewable Energy Systems and/or installing the Renewable Energy Systems and/or Energy Efficiency Improvements, including

the costs of necessary equipment, materials, and labor and the cost of verification of such systems and improvements.

- § 50-5. Procedures of eligibility.
- A. Any property owner in the County may submit an application to EIC on such forms as have been prepared by EIC and made available to property owners on the website of EIC and on the Broome County government website.

- B. Every application submitted by a property owner shall be reviewed by EIC acting on behalf of the County, which shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the criteria for making a financing enumerated in § 50-6 of this chapter. EIC may also request further information from the property owner where necessary to aid in its determination.
- C. If a positive determination on an application is made by EIC acting on behalf of the County, the property owner shall be deemed a Qualified Property Owner and shall be eligible to participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program in accordance with the procedure set forth under § 50-7 of this chapter; provided that in no case shall a property owner that has received funds from another municipal corporation for the acquisition, construction and installation of energy efficiency improvements and/or renewable energy systems be deemed a Qualified Property Owner.

§ 50-6. Application criteria.

Upon the submission of an application, EIC acting on behalf of the County, shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the following criteria for the making of a financing:

- A. The proposed Energy Efficiency Improvement and/or Renewable Energy Systems are determined to be cost effective **based on guidelines issued** by the Authority;
- B. <u>The property owner may not be in bankruptcy and the property may not constitute</u> property subject to any pending bankruptcy proceeding; [The proposed energy efficiency improvements and/or renewable energy systems will generate an estimated annual cost savings greater than the annual charge payments;]
- C. The amount financed under the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program shall be repaid over a term not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements to be installed on the property as determined by EIC;
- D. [C]. Sufficient funds are available from EIC to provide to the property owner;
- **<u>E</u> [D].** The property owner is current in payments on any existing mortgage;
- <u>F</u>[E]. The property owner is current in payments on any existing real property taxes and has been current on real property taxes for the previous three years; and
- <u>G</u>[F]. Such additional criteria, not inconsistent with the criteria set forth above, as the County, or EIC acting on its behalf, may set from time to time
- § 50-7. Opt-in, Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement.
- A. A qualified property owner may participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program through the execution of an energize <u>NY</u> finance agreement made by and

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between the Qualified Property Owner and EIC, acting on behalf of the County (the "Energize NY Finance Agreement).

- B. Upon execution of the energize finance agreement, the qualified property owner shall be eligible to receive funds from EIC acting on behalf of the County, for the acquisition, construction, and installation of qualifying renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements; provided the requirements of § 50-8 of this chapter have been met.
- C. The Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement shall include the terms and conditions of repayment set forth under § 50-9 of this chapter.

§ 50-8. Energy audit, renewable energy system feasibility study.

- A. No funds shall be made available for Energy Efficiency Improvements unless determined to be appropriate through an Energy Audit, as defined in § 50-3.
- B. No funds shall be made available for a Renewable Energy System unless determined to be feasible through a renewable energy system feasibility study as defined in § 50-3.
- C. The cost of such Energy Audit and/or Renewable Energy System Feasibility Study shall be borne solely by the property owner but may be included in the financed amount if the work is approved.
- § 50-9. Terms and conditions repayment.

The Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement between the Qualified Property Owner and EIC acting on behalf of the County, shall set forth the terms and conditions of repayment in accordance with the following:

- A. The principal amount of the funds paid to the Qualified Property Owner hereunder, together with the interest thereon, shall be paid by the property owner as a charge on their real property tax bill and shall be levied and collected at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes, provided that such charge shall be separately listed on the tax bill. The County shall make payment to EIC or its designee in the amount of all such separately listed charges within 30 days of the County real property tax due date.
- B. The term of such repayment shall be determined at the time the Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement is executed by the property owner and EIC, provided that in no case shall the term exceed the weighted average of the useful life of the systems and improvements as determined by EIC acting on behalf of the County.
- C. The rate of interest for the charge shall be fixed by EIC acting on behalf of the County at the time the Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement is executed by the property owner and EIC.
- D. The charge shall constitute a lien upon the real property benefited by the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program <u>as set forth in Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law</u> and shall run with the land. A transferee of title to the benefited real property shall be required to pay any future installments, including interest thereon.

§ 50-10. Verification and report.

A. EIC shall be responsible for verifying and reporting to the County on the installation and performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by such Program.

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B. The County shall verify and report on the installation and performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program in such form and manner as the Authority may establish.

Section 2 This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes an agreement with the Greater Binghamton Chamber of Commerce, 5 South College Drive, Suite 100, Binghamton, New York 13905 for funding from the Marketing and Economic Development allocation of the occupancy tax for the period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in consideration of said agreement, the County shall pay the Contractor and amount not to exceed \$14,500, for the term of the agreement, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the payments hereinabove authorized shall be made from budget line 90000099.6005026 (Marketing & Economic Development), and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative is hereby empowered to execute any such agreements, documents, or papers, approved as to form by the Department of Law, as may be necessary to implement the intent and purpose of this Resolution.
