By All Members Seconded by Mr. Pasquale RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW YORK STATE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO APPROVE AN EXTENSION OF THE NEW YORK STATE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE TOWN OF MAINE

WHEREAS, New York State Electric and Gas developed a targeted natural gas marketing program to expand growth of the existing natural gas system, including acquiring new customers that do not currently utilize natural gas in their homes or businesses and current customers that do not utilize natural gas for space heating, constructing natural gas main extensions and establishing new natural gas franchises, and

WHEREAS, the Community Development Grant Program is designed to expand natural gas to communities where either no approved gas franchise exists or where there is an existing approved franchise but no gas main extension and match funding provided by local, regional and state agencies is insufficient to offset the capital costs to construct natural gas infrastructure in a community, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Maine is such a community that is pursuing construction of natural gas infrastructure and this community within Broome County wishes to enter into a Natural Gas Expansion Pilot Program with New York State Electric and Gas but needs matching funds from the Community Development Grant Program to offset surcharges to potential customers, and

WHEREAS, said Community Development Grant Program through New York State Electric and Gas has since expired, though considering the resounding support of the project in the community, local and County governments, NYSEG has committed to approve the Pilot Program even though the program deadline has passed, and

WHEREAS, this Broome County Legislature endeavors to enrich the lives and livelihoods of all those that reside, work and own businesses in Broome County and prioritizes the welfare and well-being of County residents, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby strongly encourages the New York State Public Service Commission to approve the New York State Electric & Gas Natural Gas Expansion Pilot Program within the Town of Maine, and be it

FÜRTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward a certified copy of the resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Public Service Commission Chairman John R. Rhodes, Secretary to the Public Service Commission Kathleen H. Burgess, Senate Majority Leader John J. Flanagan, Assembly Speaker Carl E. Heastie, Senator Frederick J.
