Barbara J. Fiala, County Executive:

The Department of Audit and Control has compiled a summary of the status of accounts receivable balances in various County departments as of December 31, 2006.

Our analysis of the data provided has revealed the following critical issues:

■ The Aviation Department's receivables show a 607% increase in the 61-90 day category. However, \$3,853 of the \$3,988 balance (96.6%) has been paid in January of 2007. Also, regarding the over 90 day category, the Aviation Department has done a resolution request to write off remaining balances of \$8,632 and \$1,255 owed by Piedmont and PSA Airlines (bankruptcies).

Attached are schedules summarizing the status of significant receivables as of December 31, 2006. The criteria that we established for monitoring was to track balances that were in excess of \$100,000 as of December 31, 2006 and generate from fee for service transactions. If you are aware of other receivable categories that are a risk of becoming uncollectible, please advise.
