PERSONNEL COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES March 12, 2024

The Committee meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 4:00 p.m. Ms. Micha moved the agenda, seconded by Ms. Ryan.

In response to a question from the Committee, Mr. Phelps stated that altogether, there were 138 vape violations, 198 vape and tobacco violations, and 41 violations sold to minors. The Health Department received a total of \$42,300 in fines. In response to a second question, Mr. Phelps stated that the previous amount charged for every violation was \$10 and is now at \$100 per vape piece.
