Impacts to 100-Year Floodplain - The project area, like much of Otsiningo Park, is located within the 100-Year Floodplain. No clearing or grading is required for the project and the area to be disturbed for new fencing and walking paths is less than one acre. Due to the scale and nature of construction, the project is not likely to result in any major flooding impacts to the area. Broome County will comply with all floodplain requirements.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE BYLAWS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BROOME COUNTY VETERANS MEMORIAL ARENA AND THE BROOME COUNTY PERFORMING ARTS THEATRE

WHEREAS, Section 2408 of the Broome County Charter and Code establishes a Board of Directors of the Broome County Veterans Memorial Arena and Broome County Performing Arts Theatre (The Forum), with the terms and powers of the Board determined by the County Legislature, and

WHEREAS, Resolutions 364 of 1972, and 321 of 1987 approved the bylaws of the Board of Directors of the Broome County Veterans Memorial Arena and Broome County Performing Arts Theater (The Forum), and

WHERESAS, the Board of Directors has identified and approved revisions to said bylaws, attached as Exhibit "A", now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby approves the Bylaws of the Board of Directors of the Broome County Veterans Memorial Arena and Brome County Performing Arts Theater (The Forum) attached as Exhibit "A".

BY LAWS BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE

BROOME COUNTY VETRANS MEMORIAL ARENA AND THE BROOME COUNTY PERFORMING ARTS THEATRE

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE

The Board of Directors of the Broome County Veterans Memorial Arena and the Broome County Performing Arts Theatre (hereinafter "Board of Directors" or "Board") is established pursuant to Section 2408 of the Broome County Charter. The purpose of the Board of Directors is to assist Broome County in the operation of the Broome County Veterans Memorial Arena (hereinafter "Arena") and the Broome County Performing Arts Theatre (hereinafter "Forum"), taking into account that the Arena has been dedicated to honor those who served our country in the military service with honor and distinction.

Article II

FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Board of Directors shall begin January 2-1 and end December 31.

Article III

MEMBERSHIP

A. Introduction

Section 2408 of the Broome County Charter authorizes the Broome County Legislature to establish the number and terms of the directors of the Board of Directors. By Resolution No. 446 of 1974 and Resolution No. 78 of 2018, the Broome County Legislature established that the Board of Directors would consist of eighteen voting members, one of which members shall be ChairmanChair of the Community Affairs Committee (presently known as the Community Development Committee) an appointee of the Broome County Legislature, or his designee, which designee shall be a member of the Community Affairs Committee. All members of the Board, other than the ChairmanChair of the Community Affairs County Legislature's appointee, or his designee, are, in accordance with Resolution No. 129 of 1972, and No. 364 of 1972, and No. 78 of 2018, appointed by the County Executive subject to confirmation by the County Legislature.

B. Terms of Office

In accordance with Resolution No. 129 of 1972 and No. 78 of 2018, Directors other than the Chairman Chair of the Community Development Committee, or his designee appointee of the County Legislature, serve staggered three year terms. The terms of six (6) Directors expire each year at midnight, December 31, except every third year, the term of only five (5) Directors terminate at said time. Membership on the board by the Chairman Chair of the Community Development Committee County Legislature's appointee—is coterminous with the term of the County Legislature.position of the Chairman Chair of said committee.

C. Rules of Active Membership

It is the policy of the Board that members of the Board be active members and regularly participate in Board business and Functions. If a Director fails to attend three (3) consecutive regularly scheduled Board meetings, the Executive Committee shall investigate into the reasons for the absences and report its findings and recommendations to the Board.

D. Recommendations Regarding Appointments and Re-Appointments to the Board.

The Board shall make recommendations to the County Executive regarding the appointment and re-appointment of Directors, other than ex-officio Directors. It is the policy of the Board not to recommend re-appointment of any such Director who will have served, as of the expiration date of the Director's term, at least sixty-six (66) consecutive months as a Director.

Except as otherwise provided herein, no later than the close of the first regularly scheduled meeting occurring on or after October 1 of every year, Directors may submit to the Nominating Committee the names of prospective candidates, including the names of Directors whose terms will expire at the end of the year, for membership of the Board of Directors beginning January 1 of the following year. The nominating Committee shall also consider prospective candidates submitted by persons other than Directors.

In the event of a vacancy in a directorship, other than an ex-officio directorship, occurring or scheduled to become effective at least six (6) months prior to the expiration of the term of said directorship, Directors may submit to the nominating committee, prior to the subsequent to the date the vacancy occurs, the names of prospective candidates to will such vacancy on the Board. The Nominating Committee shall also consider prospective candidates submitted by persons other than Directors.

All nominations must be accompanied by a resume of the prospective candidate. The Nominating Committee shall mail or personally serve on each Director a copy of all resumes timely received by the Nominating Committee. Said mailing or personal service shall be accomplished within ten (10) days of the date of final submission of the candidate names to the Nominating Committee.

At or prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board occurring at least twenty-one (21) days following the close of nominations, the Nominating Committee shall recommend <u>individuals</u> to the Board two persons to fill each vacancy.

At the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board occurring at least twenty-one (21) days following the close of nominations, the Board shall consider the recommendations of the Nominating Committee. The names of those persons recommended by the Nominating Committee shall be placed in nomination. Persons other than those recommended by the Nominating Committee may also be considered upon nominated from the floor, provided that the name of the person or persons so nominated was submitted to the Nominating Committee in a timely fashion.

The Board shall then vote on each candidate. The names of those candidates receiving votes from a majority of all Directors will be recommended to the Broome County Executive for appointment to the Board.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

A. Introduction

Officers of the Board of Directors shall consist of a Chairman Chair, a Vice Chairman Chair, and a Secretary to be selected from the membership of the Board of Directors.

B. Duties

The duties of the ChairmanChair included, presiding at the meetings of the Board of Directors, the appointment of committee members and chairpersons, the preparation of meeting agendas, and such other duties as are customarily assigned to the Chairmen under Robert's Rules of Order. The duty of the Vice ChairmanChair is to act for and on behalf of the chairmanChair in the absence of the ChairmanChair. The Secretary shall keep official minutes of the meetings of the Board, post notices of Board meetings in accordance with law and directions of the Board, make such correspondence as the Board directs and is necessary to carry out the directives of the Board, distribute to all Directors correspondence addressed to the Board, and such other duties as are customarily assigned to secretaries under Robert's Rules of Order.

C. Order of Succession

In the event that a vacancy should occur during the tenure of the office of the ChairmanChair, the Vice ChairmanChair shall automatically become ChairmanChair, and the Board of Directors shall hold an election at its next regular meeting occurring at least fifteen (15) days after said vacancy occurs or after a resignation to become effective in the future is announced, for the purpose of filling the office of Vice ChairmanChair. In

the event that a vacancy should occur during the tenure of the office of Vice ChairmanChair, or in the event that vacancies should occur simultaneously in the office of ChairmanChair and Vice ChairmanChair, the Board of Directors shall hold an election at its earliest convenience for the purpose of filling the office or offices.

In the event of a vacancy occurring in the office of Secretary, the Board of Directors shall hold an election at its next regularly scheduled meeting to fill the vacancy.

D. Term of Office

At the last regularly scheduled meeting on or before November 30 of each year, the Board of Directors shall elect a <u>ChairmanChair</u>, Vice <u>ChairmanChair</u>, and Secretary from among its membership to serve in said offices from January 1 to December 31 of the succeeding year. An officer may not be elected to serve in the same capacity unless, after having served in said capacity at least eighteen consecutive months, said person does not hold said office for a period of at least twelve consecutive months.

E. Emergency Meeting

The Executive Committee is empowered to act on behalf of the full board in the event an emergency meeting is called between official meetings. Any action by the Executive Committee is subject to ratification by the full board at the next regular meeting.

<u>F</u>E. Removal from Office

An officer may be removed from office, for cause, upon the vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total membership of the Board.

ARTICLE V

MEETINGS

A. Regular Meeting

The Board of Directors shall annually, on or after December 1, fix the date and time of the first meeting of the next year, which meeting shall be held on or before the fourth Monday of the month to begin in 20th day of January next following, in the Arena. At the first meeting of the year, the Board of Directors shall adopt a schedule of regular meetings for the year, including the date, time, and place of said meetings. The Board of Directors shall schedule at least nine (9) regular meetings for the year. No later than ten (10) days after said schedule of regular meetings is adopted, the Secretary shall provide written notice of the scheduled meetings, times and dates to all Directors.

The Board of Directors shall annually, on or after December 1, fix the date and time of the first meeting of the next year, which meeting shall be held on or before the fourth Monday of the month to begin in January, in the Arena. The Board of Directors

shall adopt a schedule of regular meetings for the following year, including the date, time, and place of said meetings, and these dates will be approved at the December meeting to go into effect starting with the following January meeting. The Board of Directors shall schedule at least nine (9) regular meetings for the year. No later than ten (10) days after said schedule of regular meetings is adopted, the Secretary shall provide written notice of the scheduled meetings, times and dates to all Directors.

B. Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Secretary upon the direction of the ChairmanChair or upon written request signed by at least six (6) Directors. Notice in writing stating the date, time, place, and purpose of the special meeting shall be served personally or by email upon each Director at least five (5) calendar days before the date fixed for this special meeting. A member may waive, in writing, the service of notice for a special meeting. Only business specified in the notice thereof may be discussed or transacted at the special meeting.

C. Quorum

A quorum shall be nine (9) voting members of the Board of Directors.

D. Voting

Members of the Board of Directors may vote in person only.

Except as otherwise required herein or by law, meetings of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, latest edition.

ARTICLE VI

COMMITTEES

The <u>ChairmanChair</u> shall appoint members and chairmen of all committees, standing or special, subject to <u>-confirmation</u> by the Board. The <u>ChairmanChair</u> or, upon designation by the <u>ChairmanChair</u>, the Vice <u>ChairmanChair</u> shall be a member, exofficio, of each Committee, with the right to vote.

The <u>ChairmanChair</u> may make temporary appointments to fill vacancies on any Committee caused by the absence of members thereof. The <u>ChairmanChair</u> of a Standing Committee may designate one of the members as temporary <u>ChairmanChair</u> of a specific Committee meeting or portion of a specific Committee meeting. In the case of the absence of the <u>ChairmanChair</u> of a Standing Committee at any meeting, and no designation of a temporary <u>ChairmanChair</u>, the members present shall choose one of their members as temporary <u>ChairmanChair</u>.

There shall be the following Standing Committees:

- (a) Nominating Committee: This Committee shall consist of the ChairmanChair or Vice ChairmanChair and four (4) other members of the Board of Directors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to recommend to the Board a slate of officers at least twenty (20) days prior to the regularly scheduled meeting at which officers will be elected. The Nominating Committee shall also be charged with the responsibility of recommending to the Board of Directors new members. To this end, the Nominating Committee shall continuously solicit names of persons who would be appropriate members of the Board, representing various segments of the County always ensuring that at least one member of the board is a Veteran, and who would further the purposes of the Board of Directors. Members eligible for reappointment may not serve on the Nominating Committee.
- (b) Program and Public Relations Committee: This Committee shall consist of the ChairmanChair or the Vice ChairmanChair and three (3) other members of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall have the responsibility to recommend

general policy to the Board relating to the events to be held at the Arena and the Forum, and to otherwise assist County officials in the proper utilization of these facilities.

- (c) Special Arena and Forum Committee: This Committee shall consist of the Chairman Chair or the Vice Chairman Chair and four (4) other members of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall have the responsibility to recommend general policies in reference to the maintenance of the Arena and the Forum and any necessary and all equipments, and to provide necessary safeguards for the protection and welfare of the facility's patrons. Merged with Special Committees
- (b) Facility Support Committee: This Committee shall consist of the Chair or the Vice Chair and a minimum of three (3) other members of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall have the responsibility to recommend general policy to the Board relating to the events to be held at the Arena and the Forum, and to otherwise assist County officials in the proper utilization of these facilities. This Committee shall also have the responsibility to recommend general policies in reference to the maintenance of the Arena and the Forum including the facility, all equipment therein, and to provide necessary safeguards for the protection and welfare of the facility's patrons.
- (d) Finance Committee: This Committee shall consist of the ChairmanChair or the Vice ChairmanChair and three (3) other members of the Board of Directors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to recommend general policy in reference to any and all fees, tickets, charges, sales and rentals at the Arena and the Forum including, but not limited to, charges for the use of the Arena and the Forum, and any and all events, and charges in reference to any and all concession agreements. This Committee is also charged with the responsibility if the timely preparation and review of the annual capital and operating budgets, and in making recommendations regarding the budget to the Board of Directors as follows: capital projects budget no later than the last regularly scheduled meeting held on or before April 30; operating budget no later than the last regularly scheduled meeting held on or before June 30. The Finance Committee shall work with the appropriate County officials in preparing annually a budget development calendar, and the Finance Committee shall keep the Board apprised regularly as to the progress of the budget.
- (c) Finance Committee: This Committee shall consist of the Chair or the Vice Chair and a minimum of three (3) other members of the Board of Directors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to recommend general policy in reference to any, not limited to, charges for the use of the Arena and the Forum, and any and all events, and charges in reference to any and all concession agreements. This committee will review all waivers and report to the entire board any recommendations for approval or disapproval of submitted waivers. This Committee is also charged with the responsibility of the timely review of the annual capital and operating budgets, and in making recommendations regarding the budget to the Board of Directors as follows: capital projects budget no later than the last regularly scheduled meeting held on or before April 30; operating budget no later than the last regularly scheduled meeting held on or before June 30. The Finance Committee shall work with the appropriate County officials in preparing annually a budget development calendar, and the Finance Committee shall keep the Board apprised regularly as to the progress of the budget. A copy of all waiver

requests will be furnished to Arena Board Members prior to the next scheduled board meeting.

- (d) Executive Committee: This Committee shall consist of the officers of the Board of Directors, plus a minimum of two (2) other members of the Board. This Committee shall consist of the officers of the Board of Directors, plus four (4) other members of the Board. This Committee will have the responsibility to transact such business as may be designated by the ChairmanChair between Board meetings and may be convened at his request. In furtherance of the interest and welfare of the Arena and the Forum, the Executive Committee shall maintain regular contact with the County Executive, the ChairmanChair of the Legislature, and the Legislature's Community Development Committee. The executive Committee shall be the Board's principal liaison with the County government apparatus and the public.
- (f) By laws Committee: This Committee shall consist of the Chairman or the Vice Chairman and four (4) other members of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall have the responsibility to review the by laws annually and to recommend to the Board of Directors such changes as the Committee deems prudent and necessary.
- (eg) Veterans Committee: This Committee shall consist of the <u>ChairmanChair</u> or Vice <u>ChairmanChair</u> and two (2) other members of the Board of Directors. <u>The Committee Chair should be a Veteran</u>. This Committee shall have the responsibility to recommend to the Board of Directors such actions as will enhance the purpose for which the Broome County Veteran's Memorial Arena was originally dedicated.

Special Committees as may be appropriate to assist the Board in the conduct of its affairs may be authorized from time to time by the Board of Directors ChairmanChair. Each Special Committee shall terminate automatically as of December 31 of each year. One such committee is the Special Arena and Forum Committee: this Committee shall consist of the ChairmanChair or the Vice ChairmanChair and four (4) other members of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall have the responsibility to recommend general policies in reference to the maintenance of the Arena and the Forum and any necessary and all equipment, and to provide necessary safeguards for the protection and welfare of the facility's patrons.

Except as otherwise required herein or by law, Committee meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, latest edition.

ARTICLE VII

GIFTS

By Section 2408 of the Broome County Charter, the Broome County Board of Directors is authorized to approve all gifts to the Arena and the Forum. The Board shall, unless otherwise allowed by the county, use and permit the use of said gifts for purposes

in connection with the Arena and Forum, including, but not limited to, the operation, maintenance, and improvement of said facilities.

ARTICLE VIII

INDEMNIFICATION

By Resolution No. 364, adopted December 19, 1972, Broome County has agreed that the Board of Directors, either individually or jointly, while acting in their official capacity as Directors, are agents of Broome County, and in consideration of the services provided by the Board, the County will indemnify and save harmless the Directors from and against all claims, suits, damages, costs, losses, and expenses, in any manner resulting from, arising out of, or connected with their activities as members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENTS

Subject to ratification by the County, these by laws may be amended from time to time by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire membership of the Board. Proposed amendments must be mailed to or personally served upon each Director at least five (5) days before the meeting at which the amendments(s) is to be voted upon.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT WITH CAROUSEL SPORTS, LLC FOR A PROFESSIONAL HOCKEY FRANCHISE AT THE VISIONS FEDERAL CREDIT UNION VETERANS MEMORIAL ARENA FOR 2024-2027

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 222 of 2021, authorized an agreement with Carousel Sports, LLC for a professional hockey franchise at the Visions Federal Credit Union Veterans Memorial Arena for the period on or about June 1, 2021 through the conclusion of any 2023-2024 season Hockey club playoff games, and

WHEREAS it is desired at this time to renew said agreement on substantially similar terms and conditions, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes the renewal of the agreement with Carousel Sports, LLC, 51 Stuart Street, Binghamton, New York 13901 for a professional hockey franchise at the Visions Federal Credit Union Veterans Memorial Arena for the period June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2027, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in consideration of said agreement, the Hockey Club shall pay for 2023-2024 season rent at the current rates in effect of \$3,000 per game (\$1 per ticket, less 100 free comps for games where distributed tickets exceed 3,500) and at the beginning of the 2024-2025 season and thereafter, the Hockey Club shall pay rent for the use of the Arena for each exhibition, pre-season, regular season of playoff games in the amount of \$3,500 per game; if the number of distributed tickets exceeds 3,750 for any game, rent will increase to \$1.25 per distributed ticket (\$1.25 per ticket, less 100 free comps for games where distributed tickets exceed 3,750), and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, all tickets sold from any location will be included in the calculation of additional rent. The Hockey Club agrees that for the purposes of the calculation of additional rent, there will be a per game cap on complimentary tickets given by the Hockey Club of 100. If the amount of complimentary tickets for any game exceeds the cap, the amount of complimentary tickets that exceeds the cap will be treated as tickets distributed for the purpose of calculation additional rent, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Hockey Club shall also reimburse the county for any and all direct expenses incurred by the County in conjunction with events put on by or on behalf of the Hockey Club at the Arena, subject to the Approval of the Arena Manager, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the County shall furnish, at its own expense, for each scheduled hockey game, Arena staff adequate to serve the needs of the public. The Arena staff shall consist of all personnel not directly related to the presentation of the hockey game, including, among others, ticket takers, ushers, security officers, rink attendants, and personnel to resurface ice before and during each game, and be it

Such personnel may include, among others, players, officials, referees, linesmen, scorers, timers, statisticians, goal judges, announcers, organists and two or three municipal police officers based on anticipated attendance. All personnel furnished by the Hockey Club shall be subject to the reasonable requirements of the Arena Manager or his designee regarding standards of conduct and use of the Arena premises as a public facility, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, at the beginning of the 2023-2024 Season, the County agrees to assign to the Hockey Club ten (10) percent concession revenue resulting from Hockey Club events (exclusive of sales and use taxes imposed on concession sales) pursuant to the agreement between Food Consultants, Inc. and the County, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County may, if it so elects, at any time terminate this Agreement and the term hereof in the event that an agreement is entered into for an AHL hockey team to play in the Arena, provided that the County gives written notice to the Hockey Club on or before January 15th for the following season, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event that Hockey club undergoes a change in control the County may terminate this agreement immediately upon written notice to the Hockey Club. "Change of Control "means the occurrence of one or more of the following: (i) the acquisition by any person or related groups of persons whether by tender or exchange offer made directly to the shareholders or partners, open market purchases, or any other transaction or series of transactions of 50% or more of the stock or other ownership interest of the Hockey Club, (ii) a merger or consolidation in which the Hockey Club is not the surviving entity or (iii) any reverse merger in which the Hockey Club is the surviving entity but in which the securities or other ownership interest of such Hockey Club immediately prior the consummation of such reverse merger represent less than 50% of the combined total voting power of such entities stock or other ownership interest immediately after consummation of such merger, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Hockey Club shall not retain the "poring rights" for food and beverage products sold within the Arena, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Hockey Club shall have the exclusive right to market Arena skyboxes, including "all event" rental arrangements. The County reserves the right to charge separate prices for skybox tickets at non-Hockey Club events. Purchasers of skybox tickets from the Hockey Club shall have the right of first refusal on tickets for non-Hockey Club events for a three-week period after the announced on-sale date for the non-hockey event. If the purchaser has not exercised the option within that time period, the Arena Box Office Staff may sell the rights to use those boxes at non-Hockey Club events. The County shall be entitled to one hundred percent (100%) of all non-Hockey Club event skybox ticket payments and non-Hockey Club rental payments, and be it


