#18 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE CHILDHOOD LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM GRANT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ADOPTING A PROGRAM BUDGET FOR 2022-2023

Mrs. O'Brien made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Kaminsky to amend the grant funding amount in the 3<sup>rd</sup> WHEREAS paragraph, the RESOLVED paragraph, and the 1<sup>st</sup> FURTHER RESOLVED paragraph to replace \$375,698 with \$380,200.

In response to a question from the Committee, Public Health Director Mary McFadden stated that this grant has been around for approximately seven years. Two primary prevention grants were merged together, resulting in a reduction of funding in the last two years. There are advocacy efforts taking place at the State level to reinstate lost funding.
