HEALing Communities Study Overview:


The NIDA HEALing Communities Study (HCS) is a multi-state study targeting 67 communities among 4 states, NY, KY, MA, and OH. In New York, the study is a partnership between the National Institute of Drug Abuse, Columbia University, and the participating counties. Currently, Broome County is in Phase 5 of Wave 2. The goal of the study is to reduce opioid overdose deaths by 40% over the course of three years based on fatal opioid overdose rates from 2018/2019. The study will utilize targeted interventions to address increasing access to medicated assisted treatment for Opioid Use Disorder, increasing Naloxone distribution, and reducing high-risk opioid prescribing.

HCS Broome Overview:

Phase 0: January 2022-July 2022

Developed Landscape Analysis, completed Readiness Assessment, began recruitment for Workgroup, attending Wave 2 Trainings, held initial orientation meeting for Workgroup.

Phase 2: August 2022-September 2022

Subcommittees (Communications, Data, ORCCA) were developed, Community Profile was created and edited, began data analysis, identifying data gaps, Charter approval, introduced HCS Portal and Agent Based Modeling to the Workgroup. System Dynamic Model orientation continued for Implementation Team.

Phase 1: July 2022-August 2022

Workgroup identified what is working, what is not working, training and TA needs, began Charter development, continued orientation for Workgroup. First System Dynamic Model Think-Tank held in June.

Phase 3: September 2022-November 2022

Subcommittees began meeting. Developed dissemination plan for Wave 2 Campaign 1 which focused on education and awareness about Naloxone and Fentanyl with a primary focus on audiences of individuals who use drugs and do not know about Fentanyl and those who use drugs and seek out/know about Fentanyl. Wave 2 Campaign 1 launched on social media, collected data metrics for W2C1. Development of dashboards and finalization of Community Profile. Continued work with SDM team.

Phase 4: October 2022-January 2023

Action Planning began, introduced Workgroup to Action Plan, brainstorming, mapping out ORCCA-based programs already in existence, identified strengths, barriers, data needs, feasibility of specific interventions, impact of specific interventions, potential community partners, and which interventions with need funding and RFPs. Action Plan draft was submitted. Received Feedback from CU, received feedback from Workgroup, made changes. Reviewed Action Plan and feedback with SDM team and incorporated models which accounted for COVID and ongoing high overdose risk. Finalized Action Plan submitted. Began RFP, application, and rubric development and introducing Workgroup to Implementation Plan Agreements.

Phase 5: February 2023-December 2023

RFPs were released, submitted, reviewed, and scored in the first two months of Phase 5. As of March 1, 2023, awarded agencies have not been selected. Currently, the Implementation Team (Jillian Beloch, Megan Olmstead, and Dorian Feltner) are working with HCS Workgroup partners and additional community agencies to implement the selected interventions outlined in the Action Plan, including but not limited to: EMS and Broome County Sheriff Naloxone Leave-Behind Programs; Naloxone trainings at the Broome County Library twice a month geared toward increasing Naloxone access to those who are on probation; Drug Take Back Days; accredited education event for pharmacists and prescribers in partnership with Binghamton University's School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences; increasing Naloxone distribution through OASAS and Opioid Overdose Prevention Programs in Broome County; enhancing linkage and retention in medicated assisted treatment programs; a mobile Harm Reduction Van supported by centralized HCS funding to address needs in overdose hotspots and rural communities. Wave 2 Campaign 2: MOUD Awareness & Anti-Stigma launches March 6, 2023 and runs through May 5, 2023. The goal of this campaign is to reduce stigma associated with utilizing MOUD and increasing access and demand for MOUD in Broome County. The HCS Communications Subcommittee plans to utilize Peers employed in local treatment and harm reduction agencies as part of the campaign.

Planning for Sustainability:

Phase 6: Ongoing January 2022-December 2023

The goal of Phase 6 is to address sustainability of the projects implemented through the HEALing Communities Study. Columbia University has technical assistance coordinators to assist agencies with tasks such as grant writing or strategic planning for continuing these interventions beyond December 2023. The HEALing Communities Study Workgroup will utilize 2023 meetings to review data associated with the interventions, trouble-shoot, and plan for the longevity of the work being done by the community stakeholders taking part in this work.
