The Broome County Sheriff's Office arrested a Town of Conklin man this afternoon after an assault investigation.

At about 12:05 pm uniformed deputies were dispatched the area of Brady Hill Road, Town of Conklin, for a male causing a disturbance. It was reported that a white male, described as bare-foot, was walking in the center of the roadway yelling for help and acting strange. Upon arrival of a uniformed deputy, the male, identified as 35-year-old Adam G. Gurney, was located on Brady Hill Road and immediately began fighting with the deputy. The deputy was able to contain him until back-up officers arrived on scene. It was determined that Gurney was under the influence of an illicit drug. He was yelling, speaking incoherently and rambling. Gurney had fresh cuts and blood on his hands and told deputies the blood on his hands was from his dead girlfriend. Deputies responded to a residence about one mile away to perform a welfare check on the residents. A female was located within the residence with serious injuries to her face, however, she denied medical treatment. Arrangements were made for her to stay with family. Gurney was subsequently charged with the offenses listed below. He was taken to the Central Arraignment Part Court to be arraigned later today.
