## MEDIA RELEASE

The Broome County Sheriff's Office made the following arrest early yesterday morning:

On Friday, February 18, 2022 at about 1:30 am, deputies responded to a report of a motor vehicle accident on Hawleyton Road near the intersection of Park Avenue in the Town of Binghamton. Witnesses reported seeing a vehicle traveling north on Hawleyton Road lose control and leave the roadway striking some trees. The operator of the vehicle, Terrell Wilson, was able to exit the vehicle on his own, however, the passenger, a 39-year-old female was injured and entrapped in the vehicle. Wilson attempted to interfere with extrication efforts and had to be restrained by deputies on scene. The passenger was extricated by fire personnel and transported to General hospital with an arm injury.

Wilson displayed signs of alcohol intoxication. He was uncooperative with deputies on scene and refused to perform field sobriety tests. Wilson was placed under arrest for the suspicion of driving while intoxicated. The subsequent investigation determined Wilson's privilege to operate a motor vehicle in New York State was revoked due to a previous conviction for driving while intoxicated. Wilson also had a Court ordered ignition interlock restriction on his driver's license. The vehicle he was operating had no such device installed.

Wilson was transported to the Sheriff's Office headquarters for additional investigation and arrest processing. While at the Sheriff's Office Wilson submitted to a chemical test of his breath and he was found to have a .11% blood alcohol content. He was issued traffic tickets for the offenses listed below and directed to appear in Court at a later date. He was transported to his residence and released. The vehicle Wilson was operating was towed from the accident scene.

**Arrestee:**

Terrell Wilson, 36, of Binghamton, N.Y.

**Charges:**

Driving while intoxicated with a previous conviction within 10 years, a felony  
Operating a motor vehicle with more than .08 of 1% BAC, 2<sup>nd</sup> offense, a felony  
Aggravated unlicensed operation 1<sup>st</sup> degree, a felony  
Circumvent an interlock device, a misdemeanor  
Moved from lane unsafely, a violation  
Speed not reasonable and prudent, a violation
