Dear Broome County Resident,

Thank you for your interest in the Project Lifesaver Program. This program was originally funded by DCJS (NYS Dept. of Criminal Justice Services) and NYS Missing Persons Clearinghouse through multiple grants. The program is intended for Broome County residents who are affected by Autism, Downs Syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injury, Alzheimer's, Dementia and have a history of, or severe risk of wandering away from home. The program consists of the "client" receiving a bracelet that contains a mini FM radio transmitter. In the event that the client wanders away from a caregiver, the Sheriff's Office is equipped with special receivers that can detect the transmitter on the client, up to a four-mile radius from where the client originally wandered from.

Though your loved one may have one of these ailments, not everyone can qualify for this program. The bracelets/kits are estimated \$350 a piece and sometimes are covered by health insurance. There is no monthly fee. Replacement bracelets are a nominal expense and are the responsibility of the client's family. *(Many times, they are provided free of charge)* Listed below, is a strict list of **strict qualifications** a potential client **must** have before being considered for this program.
